India, officially the Republic of India is the seventh-largest country by area, the second-most populous country with over 1.2 billion people, and the most populous democracy in the world. India is a federal constitutional republic governed under a parliamentary system consisting of 29 states and 7 union territories.

It is known from archaeological evidence that a highly sophisticated urbanized culture—the Indus civilization—dominated the north western part of the subcontinent from about 2600 to 2000 BCE. From that period on, India functioned as a virtually self-contained political and cultural arena, which gave rise to a distinctive tradition that was associated primarily with Hinduism, the roots of which can largely be traced to the Indus civilization. Other religions, notably Buddhism and Jainism, originated in India—though their presence there is now quite small—and throughout the centuries residents of the subcontinent developed a rich intellectual life in such fields as mathematics, astronomy, architecture, literature, music, and the fine arts.

India remains one of the most ethnically diverse countries in the world. Apart from its many religions and sects, India is home to innumerable castes and tribes, as well as to more than a dozen major and hundreds of minor linguistic groups from several language families unrelated to one another. Religious minorities, including Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, and Jains, still account for a significant proportion of the population; collectively, their numbers exceed the populations of all countries except China.

## **Discover India 2019**

As part of Short Term Exchange program under Rotary Youth Exchange, Rotary District 3054 initiated hosting its first International Youth Camp named Discover India in 2015. This is going to be the 4<sup>th</sup> edition of Discover India, which has been able to create a brand for itself among the many International Youth camps organised every year by various Rotary Districts and Clubs.

Rotary District 3054 and host club RC Ahmedabad Supreme invites 24 Youths from across the world for a journey that will give them first hand feel and understanding of incredible India and an opportunity to see some parts of our Rotary district 3054. Please send in your application using regular short-term youth exchange form available with youth exchange officers of your club or district. **Last date to send in your application is 15th November 2018.** The application must be endorsed and signed by sponsoring Rotary club signatories and District Youth Exchange Chairman.

**Camp Fee:**

Euro 500 **or** USD 590. The camp fee is to be paid in cash at the time of arrival at the camp.

There is no additional cost involved in the camp, except out of pocket expenses of shopping etc. and for the activities that the participants may undertake, and which is not part of main camp program.

The applicant is expected to bear his / her cost of round-trip travel to Ahmedabad (Gujarat) India, and will have to bear for any additional expenses and any pre-or-post event, travels, meals, or accommodation not covered during the camp program.

**Insurance:**

All participants should be adequately insured for travel and medical cover of USD 100,000 as per the RI Insurance guidelines. Please submit a copy of your Insurance policy along with a copy of your passport to the camp organizers on your arrival.
